
NAIT PROGRAM PREVIEW



EXTREME WEATHER

Is my child's bus running? Coming home early?

Throughout the winter, weather and road conditions are constantly monitored with the safety of students and staff at the center of all of our decisions. We strive to inform parents of any delays or cancellations as quickly as possible. Here's how you may be notified:

- Call/text from your school Local radio stations
- Bus Status app

How we decide:

When temperatures and/or wind chill is -40 or colder, buses are CANCELLED. Notice may be given the night before or in the



Buses may run in the afternoon during extreme cold weather under certain circumstances. Weather checks start very early with The Weather Network and phone calls to designated staff living in each local area.



- If your child attends: meaningfu learning still occurs
- will be made to ensure they do not fall behind



- Decision is based on:

 Local road conditions

 RCMP travel advisories

 Weather and wind warnings

 Local municipality

Your bus driver also has complete discretion to cancel a route should they feel travel is unsafe.



If a decision is required around temperature and/or road conditions, the Director of Transportation

- consults with:

 Local bus drivers
- School principals Superintendent of Schools



Parents always have the final say about their child's safety and well-being and can always choose whether or not to have their child take the bus.

HIGHLIGHTS



Personal Mobile Devices and Social Media in Schools

Parent feedback strongly supports a policy to restrict mobile devices use during school hours to reduce distractions, protect student well-being, and enhance learning. Key considerations, including enforceable rules, differentiation by grade levels and educational purposes, consistent consequences, and addressing communication needs, have been incorporated into the new administrative procedure, which is now in effect.

Alberta Education Satisfaction Surveys

The Ministry of Education will conduct its annual satisfaction telephone and online surveys to collect public and participant perceptions of Alberta's education system. These surveys gather responses from a random sample of parents, the public, high school students, teachers, principals, and school board trustees, as well as employers of recent high school graduates. Advanis Inc. will begin survey administration of the telephone/online surveys on January 20, 2025, with an expected conclusion in May 2025.

Early Learning Report

Director of Inclusive Education and Early Learning, Sha Tichkowsky, shared an overview of the Division's Early Learning Program, which serves children in Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten. Nine schools offer Kindergarten, with full-day programs at four locations, and preschools also operate in two schools. Early intervention supports include speech and language services, occupational therapy, and literacy programs.

2025-2026 Calendar

Two draft calendars for the upcoming school year have been presented to the Board for consideration. Shaped by input from staff, parents, and students gathered through recent surveys, the drafts will now be shared with principals and school councils for additional feedback.

Science Fair

The St. Paul and District Steam Society is hosting its third annual Science Fair on Saturday, April 12, 2025. More information is available here.

Legion Remembrance Day Contest

Schools participated in the Legion's annual Remembrance Day contest, with 27 students recognized for their outstanding work in visual art and writing. Presentations are happening this month to celebrate their achievements, with some winners advancing to the national level. Thank you to the St. Paul Legion for organizing this meaningful contest and fostering the tradition of remembrance in our community.



École Mallaig Construction Update

Alberta Infrastructure is managing this project, with tenders closing on January 28 and an award is expected in early February. Construction is anticipated to begin within three weeks of receiving a letter of intent from the province which is projected to take just over two years to complete. The Division and County will be reaching out to community stakeholders to continue evaluating daycare options. The Province has confirmed the project will be receiving the standard \$250,000 for playground development.

PowerSchool Data Breach

The Division's Student Information System provider recently experienced a data breach. Investigations by PowerSchool and St. Paul Education confirm that **no** data belonging to our students, staff, or parents was affected.



New Myrnam School Delegation

A delegation of students and staff from New Myrnam School delivered an engaging and informative presentation about the school's recent Skills Canada Exploration Day. The event featured a design challenge centered on creating a sustainable dwelling, with the planning process incorporating various skills to provide a valuable learning experience.
